Veterans Affairs News

The Department of Veterans Affairs eliminated the net worth requirement to determine enrollment in the VA Health Care System. Other VA programs still require reporting of net worth as one of the criteria in determining eligibility for benefits such as Pensions and Pension with Aid and Attendance and Homebound.

Veterans who previously were denied access to the VA Health Care System due to excess net worth should reapply. It is suggested they contact an accredited Veteran Service Officer (VSO) for assistance. The Cumberland County Veterans Affairs has two accredited VSOs and can assist. Additionally, any veterans or surviving family member of a veteran may wish to seek information on potential benefits available from the Federal, State and County governments by calling 717-240-6178 or 888-697-0371.
