ROTC/JROTC Highlights

Listed below are some activities and successes of the ROTC/JROTC battalions in our area. They were extracted from reports provided by each battalion and edited/paraphrased for brevity. The full reports are on our web-page: www.AUSAcbcv.org

Dickinson College: 95 cadets

In October, we took a team down to the Army 10-miler. We also sent a team of hard chargers via CH-47 to Ft Dix for 2d ROTC Brigade's Ranger Challenge. Our senior class performed well in the component selection process. All 16 received their component of choice, with 8 of 16 receiving Active Duty. Of note, 4 seniors placed amongst the top 10% of active duty cadets and 5 have earned the distinction of DMG.

Shippensburg College: 104 cadets

Cadet Colin Brackin, a graduating senior, was selected as the Cadet of the Year by US Army Cadet Command. He was ranked number one from more than 5300 cadets nationwide. Several cadets completed a 30-day ROTC overseas tour: Cody Sullivan (Hungary), Hannah Strauch (Tailand), and Daniel Knney (Lithuania). These tours are part of Cadet Command's Cultural Learning and Language Proficiency Program. Cadet groups, under the leadership of a senior ROTC instructor, work with foreign military and non-governmental agencies in a variety of tasks.

Cedar Cliff High School: 125 cadets

The dedication of our "Heroes Landing" which memorializes the five Cedar Cliff graduates who died in combat is one of the highlights of our 2015-2016 calendar. The unit continues to support many school and community events with the Color Guard. Another significant effort is support to the twice a year blood drive.

Carson Long Military Academy: 95 cadets

Founded in 1836, Carson Long is the nation's oldest private boarding school providing military leadership training. The JROTC program here is mandatory for all 9th through 12th graders. We are recognized as an "Honor Unit With Distinction" by the US Army Cadet Command. We had many successes over the past year: a 95% & 98% rating for the JROTC Program Assessment; ten cadets attended the JROTC Cadet Leadership Challenge at Camp Odyssey in Boswell, PA; Advancement to the Level II (Zero Hour Threat) phase of the JROTC Leadership and Academic Bowl Challenge and designation as the 2015 Regional Champions for the Central Pennsylvania Exhibition Drill Team Competition.

Cumberland Valley High School: 140 cadets

Established in January 2011, our cadet battalion earned a perfect score of 400 on last year's Unit Report and retained our status as an Honor Unit with Distinction, the highest qualification a JROTC unit can earn. During the 2014-15 school year, the battalion completed over 2200 community service hours supporting veterans events, color guard presentations, blood drives, school activities, and more. The battalion's Raider Team is the undefeated. defendina 4-time League champions, and the Color Guard and Drill Team both placed 2nd in the league championship last January.

Gettysburg High School: 94 cadets

Established in 2005-06, our current battalion enrolment was 10 percent of the high school enrollment. We achieved recognition as Honor Unit with Distinction during our first Formal Inspection in 2009, and have maintained that coveted status annually since then. Last year our Leadership team made it to the National Championships of JROTC Leadership and Academic Bowl (JLAB) competition by finishing in the top 40 of 1.320 teams that began the competition. Our cadets finished in 31st place nationwide in their first trip to the nationals. Annually our cadets perform several community service and service learning projects. The top two are a Big Round Top Trail clean-up as part of the Gettysburg National Military Park (GNMP) Adopt-A-Position Program and the Sqt Mac Foundation National Wreath Project where they prepare and load wreaths for shipping to Quantico National Cemetery, and also place of wreaths on graves at the Soldiers National Cemetery in Gettysburg.

Red Land High School: 129 cadets

This year's battalion is engaged and active with Color Guard presentations, supporting Freshmen Orientation and Back to School nights, and supporting our local community's Four Diamond's Cancer Awareness fund-raising event. We've partnered with Fairview Elementary school providing mentorship to students and services to the school's Parent/Teacher Organization, are planning a Service Learning Project that focuses on Veterans, and also plan to send care packages to those currently serving our nation. Our Senior Army Instructor was asked to conduct a video message to the students talking about "respect." He also teaches leadership to the newly created West Shore Marching Band students and staff.
