The Vision

- A National Museum of the United States Army (NMUSA) must become a reality in order to pay tribute and recognize the Army's past, present and future by:

 - Inspiring pride in those who have served
 - Inspiring future generations to serve



The Vision



- In October, 2014 AUSA expressed interest in playing a role in financing, construction and operations of NMUSA.
- The Army Historical Foundation (AHF) shared a similar objective.



- An Affiliation was achieved to meet the objective
 - Have the assets (people, time, dollars)
 - Army agrees
- Neither entity could do this alone
- If this Affiliation was not achieved most of us would not see the NMUSA in our lifetime

Describing the Project




(Brick & Mortar/Steel & Glass)

The Combined Entities of AHF and AUSA can accelerate the construction of the NMUSA. The finished museum will be located on an 84.8 Acre tract of ground in Fort Belvoir, Virginia and can be completed in 2019.

The first structure on the museum site (Founders Hall) will be a 12,000 +/- square foot marketing and project management building. The museum complex itself will consist of a baseline set of structures and an associated Exhibit Hall. These structures will house exhibits, management offices, control apparatus, and their associated patios and walkways, and retail spaces totaling 185,000 square feet.




The Question

- NMUSA...Can I find out something about my uncle, Sgt. Joe Jones?
 - Electronic Connect → National Archives + National Military Personnel Records Center + AHEC
 - Answer: Sgt. Joe Jones C Co, 1-16th Inf
 - C Co, 1-16th was at Normandy, 1944

2. NMUSA + AHEC

- Electronic Connect → Infantry Museum at Ft. Benning
- Maybe more information on Sgt. Joe Jones
- For sure more information on 1-16th Inf (weapons, uniforms, food, etc.)
- 3. NMUSA + AHEC + Infantry Museum
 - Electronic Connect → 1st Infantry Division Museum in Illinois
 - Much more information is made available on Sgt. Jones Army history
- 4. Estimated cost to install Founders Hall & AHEC Link 1.0...\$1M
- 5. By the time NMUSA opens in 2019...can be well down the road.

The Point – The museum system plus provides information exchange & increased visitor satisfaction...it also drives visitor traffic to other museum sites.




Organizing to Support the Project



AUSA and AHF have both determined that it is consistent with their goals and purposes to establish the NMUSA. The entities recognize that the undertaking is such that certain structural changes need to be made to AHF.

- AHF will modify its Bylaws so that the number of directors will not exceed 12.
- The former AHF Board resigns en masse.
- AUSA designates 2/3 of the new Directors up to a maximum of 8.
- The former AHF Board has elected a President (LTG(R) Schultz) who will report to the Chairman of the reconstituted new Board.



So, at the conclusion of these structural changes AUSA will have control/governance of AHF and will guide financing, construction, and completion of NMUSA.

Museum Summary



It's interesting to note that in 1814 within the Bills and Resolutions of the 13th Congress of the United States...that a Bill was crafted "to provide for the collection, preservation, and public exhibition of such flags, standards, and colors as shall have been or may hereafter be taken by the land and naval forces of the United States, from their enemies." *The start of the Museum idea*.

Now, 201 years later, the Affiliation of the Association of the United States Army and the Army Historical Foundation are proposing to the Secretary of the Army a way to deliver on the Bill's intent. We are sure the Secretaries of War in 1814, John Armstrong Jr. and James Monroe, would approve.

The Affiliation is fully cognizant of the fact that the United States Army has already committed significant resources for the establishment of a National Museum of the United States Army. The plans, designs and supporting legislation lay the groundwork for all that will follow.
